MANUSCRIPT SELECTION

The Journal of the Epsilon Alpha Mu Society (JEAMS) is a new subscription journal that seeks to publish valid and scientifically sound research that represent important advances. JEAMS is a generalist publication that welcomes submissions of research investigations from all fields of science.

We don't charge the author a submission fee or article processing charge (APC). We will not consider papers previously posted on a blog or pre-print server. Most papers are published quickly in our print journal 1 to 2 months after acceptance.

Authors should familiarize themselves with the overall editorial policies for JEAMS before submitting their paper. These policies disclose the rights and responsibilities to which authors agree when submitting and publishing their papers.

CATEGORIES OF MANUSCRIPTS

Original Articles

Minimum of 3 to 4 pages, 1,500 words, 4 exhibits, and roughly 25 references. The results of a basic science, translational science, or clinical science investigation will be accompanied by a structured abstract and exhibits.

Review Articles

Limited to 8 pages, 4,000 words, 5 exhibits, and up to 50 references. A successful review article should make the general reader feel like an expert on the topic. Although often written on a medical topic, review articles can also cover topics in technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Images or Cases

Limited to 1 page, 800 words, 4 exhibits, and up to 12 references. Interesting Images can be basic science, and doesn't necessarily have to be medical or clinical. Case Reports are always clinical, and a successful case report will describe the clinical decision making of a challenging or unusual patient.

Columns

Limited to one page, 800 words, and 3 photos or exhibits. To propose a topic and to write a column, the potential author is welcome to contact our editors. Staff / faculty are preferred as columnists.
